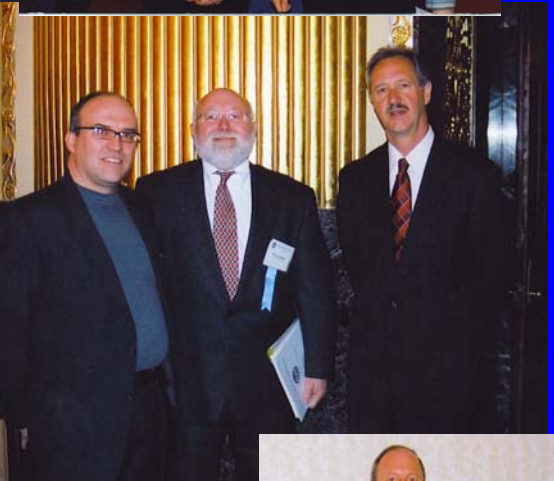

Mr. Schoenherr joined Alliant Energy in June, 2000 as Manager of External Communications. In June 2004, he stepped into the newly created position of Senior Manager of Federal Regulatory Affairs. In this role, he is focusing on federal issues under the jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), the development of regional and national wholesale energy markets, and implementation of the recently passed Energy Policy Act of 2005. He spent the first 20 years of his career at Wisconsin Energy in investor relations, system and project development, government relations, communications, infrastructure siting and strategic planning, green pricing initiatives and

He is actively involved in terrorism planning and response and serves as an alternate on the Governor's Homeland Security Council. He has over 20 years of experience in emergency management. He has been with WEM since 1990

serving as Northeast Regional Director and as Regional Director/Response Section Supervisor. Prior to joining WEM, he was the Emergency Management Director for Wood County.
